

Municipality of Belfast Report September, 2023

Kings District “L” Division Prince Edward Island



Kings District responded to a total of 23 calls for service in the Municipality of Belfast during the month of September 2023 which includes self-generated traffic enforcement.

512 calls for service in all of Kings District with 23 specific to Municipality of Belfast.

Reduce Impaired Driving through enforcement and education: King's District members remain active in their patrols throughout the area, seeking road safety concerns and violations. During the month of September, efforts 1 Highway Traffic violations and 1 impaired driving investigation.

Enhancing Police Visibility/Open Communication: King's members continue to be involved in our communities. During the month of September employees were assigned to all 13 schools in the Kings District and patrolled schools and school zones during peak times. We participated in the Dundas Wagon Train, 70 Coastal Mile Yard Sale, completed talk with seniors about Fraud prevention. We also worked with the EOC in advance of Hurricane Lee to ensure preparedness and remained available during the event assisting county residents with such things as tree maintenance and removal and regular police visibility. We completed curfew checks on prolific youths in order to keep them compliant and our supervisors participated in a leadership training and missing person training and in a very timely event, made use of new age strategies through the use of a drone during an actual missing person event and ultimately located safely. Finally, we paid tribute to fallen law enforcement officers at the Peace Officer Memorial. As we look to the future, we have a lot of mandatory training occurring in October including weapon re-certifications and tactical training.

Media Relations/PSAs: I was lucky to be reported on in a story by the Eastern Graphic showcasing my family legacy in Kings County. I also have the pleasure of reporting that our own Sergeant Coady was named L Division officer of the year at an Honorary Regimental Ball celebrating our 150th anniversary. I also had the chance to review Three Rivers bylaws and review internal processes related to the enforcement of bylaw legislation that included communicating with residents of Georgetown and the Three Rivers CAO and JJP. Kings RCMP also assisted CPS with a missing person investigation who was sadly located deceased in Kings District, the primary investigation remains with CPS.

Human Resources: As fast as we saw HR improvements we are once again impacted. Our GIS section has transitioned to Charlottetown to join a larger unit and now with provincial capacity, including continued efforts in Kings County however the Detachment is reduced by two positions. We also lost Sergeant Coady to Headquarters for the foreseeable future, he is assisting them in provincial criminal operations oversight. Constable Dustin MacIntyre is arriving in November and another external police officer hire should arrive in December. This officer will be replacing the new member we were expecting from Depot who unfortunately did not succeed in the training and an RCMP transfer from the Yukon is still expected in the new year. We continue to use the RCMP reservist program and overtime to ensure adequate resources are available especially during this time of the year as COVID is once again making its rounds, with our Detachment being no exception.
