## **Basic Emergency Management**

Kerry White and I attended Basic Emergency Management Training with PEI Emergency Measures Organization, Department of Justice and Public Safety at their Provincial Emergency Operations Center on February 1st, 2024. This is the first in a series of in-person learning sessions and upon a successful examination certification is acquired.

The class was full of people from various fields which included Red Cross, Seniors Homes, Paramedics, Firefighters, and Municipal Affairs.

The course stressed the four pillars of emergency management

1. Prevention
2. Preparedness
3. Response
4. Recovery

The day was broken up to look at each pillar in depth. There were six opportunities where we broke out into groups to do work around a fictitious Municipal Hazard Assessment. Each group was assigned a different Hazard and looked at varying factors such as demographics, susceptibility, risks and present findings to the rest of the class throughout the day. The other topic looked at in detail was "Levels of Priority" in disaster response.

1. Life Safety
2. Incident Stabilization
3. Property and Environmental Stabilization
4. Economy

At the end of the day we had to complete a mandatory examination which will allow us to Incident Command 100 Training on Thursday February 15th.

## **Incident Command System 100**

We attended Incident Command System 100 Training with PEI Emergency Measures Organization, Department of Justice and Public Safety at their Provincial Emergency Operations Center on February 15, 2024. This is the second in a series of in-person learning sessions and upon a successful examination certification is acquired.

In this session, we learned the principles of the Incident Command System and they provided us with information about the basic ICS structure and terminology used. We learned about the span of control at an Incident Command location and the various roles played by each person there.

Again, we completed a mandatory examination which is a prerequisite to attend Incident Command 200 Training on Thurs, Mar 7 & Fri, Mar 8, 2024.
